Two choices for the daytime

Choice 1 - 9:00 AM - 3:00 PM Lone Star Flight Museum - is home to one of the finest collections of restored aircraft and aviation exhibits in the nation. Over 40 restored aircraft are displayed and most are in working condition. The collection includes WWII Fighters, Bombers, Liaison Trainers, and Executive Planes. The museum is a volunteer, not-for-profit, tax exempt 501 (c) (3), educational museum, dedicated to the men and women who developed aviation to the science it is today; and, to the memory and spirit of those who flew in the defense of our country and freedom throughout the world

Choice 2 - 9:00 AM - 3:00 PM Moody Gardens - features three main attractions: the Aquarium, which is one of the largest in the world and holds many species of fish and other sealife; the Rainforest Pyramid, which contains tropical fauna and flora; and the Discovery Pyramid, which focuses on science-oriented exhibits and activities. Another major attraction is Palm Beach, a landscaped sandy area with freshwater lagoons and offering children's activities. Moody Gardens also has a RideFilm Theater with motion-based pod seating, a 3-D IMAX theater, a paddlewheel cruise boat, a hotel and a convention center. Moody Gardens commissioned a famous landscape design from Geoffrey Jellicoe. It is described in Gardens of the Mind: the Genius of Geoffrey Jellicoe by Michael Spens (Antique Collectors Club, 1992) (lunch on your own)

*Lone Star Museum, Moody Gardens, and Galveston Historical Foundation fees are specially arranged, Cessna 170 Association week-long admissions. There is simply so much to see that you will be unlikely to take it all in only one day without feeling hurried.

TUESDAY - June 26th

9:00 AM - 3:00 PM **Visit The Strand** The Strand National Historic District is located on the east end of Galveston Island. Originally, it just included Strand Street, when Islanders speak of "The Strand" they're really talking about downtown Galveston

including Strand Street, Pier's 19-22 and extending west to Post Office Street. The Strand calls itself the "Art and Entertainment District." Pub Breweries, Period-style shopping, restaurants, bakeries. The 1900 Storm Museum, The Tall Ship Elissa, and the Railroad Museum with locomotives and cars are all along/about The Strand... formerly known as "The Wall Street of the South" until the 1900 hurricane wiped out the entire city.... Now restored to its former glory.

Antebellum Mansions - Journey back in time and experience the grandeur and elegance of the many historic homes on Galveston Island. Lovingly restored and preserved, they offer a peek into the fascinating lives of Galveston's founding prominent citizens. With homes that were built from 1838 into the 1900s, they are classic examples of gold leaf ceilings, stained glass panels, rare woods, and intricate carvings from around the world. The Galveston Historical Foundation (GHF) provides a tour of the properties they manage in the package-priced tour, including Ashton Villa. The Menard Home, the 1839 Williams Home, and The Bishop's Palace and additional homes on the island also exist which are managed by others, and are available for tours by all individuals and small groups at your choice of leisure. (Small donations may exist at some properties not included in the GHF management.)

The Strand, Historic Homes, Galveston Sea Port, 1900 Storm, Elissa, Jean Lafitte, Post Office, Railroad Museum, etc. are all so much to see that you will want to return over several days. **Your fees cover weeklong admission to all the GHF attractions.**

7:00 PM Dinner will be at Casey's famous Galveston Seafood Restaurant on the seawall.

WEDNESDAY - June 27th

7:00 AM Convention Hosts Breakfast Meeting

8:30 AM After breakfast, a fun and educational bus-tour to the NASA Manned Spacecraft Center at Clear Lake for a private guided tour including actual spacecraft and afterwards to Kemah, TX - A bayside village, formerly an important port for a large fishing/shrimping fleet now developed into an attractive collection of shops, restaurants, boardwalk, and sailboat marinas. Lunch will be included at Babin's famous seafood restaurant and a visit to Aircraft Belts, Inc., a seat belt-harness mfrg/repair/re-furbishment facility for aircraft will be included. The tour will include a drive by Texas City, a huge refining complex and site of the 1948 explosion/disaster.

At the end of the day, the group will split into those who wish to return to Galveston for dinner on their own, and those who wish to proceed to Greyhound Park for a fun pari-mutuel racing, dinner, and an evening return to Galveston.
